Loudoun County Alumnae Chapter Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.

As a responsible not-for-profit organization, Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc.'s Loudoun County Alumnae Chapter (LCAC) and its 115 members, play an active role in helping to strengthen the quality of life in Loudoun County. Through partnerships with the school district and other community serving agencies, LCAC strives to be a valued contributor to serving the public.

LCAC supports causes that are aligned with the sorority's five-point thrust program. The focus areas are Educational Development, Economic Development, International Awareness and Involvement, Physical and Mental Health and Political Awareness and Involvement.

Since its chartering on April 29, 2009, the Chapter has provided more than \$50,000 toward high school seniors' college education and raised more than \$100,000 for non-profit organizations supporting women and families in need and youth education. Chapter members have logged more than 10,000 hours in their efforts to bring meaningful change and inspiration to the organizations they support.

LCAC is a recipient of the Partnership Profile Award from the Loudoun County Public School District for its support to Leesburg Elementary students and annual support to Guilford Elementary School's Thanksgiving feast.

LCAC community projects include:

- Helping to register more than 5,000 voters in Loudoun County.
- Partnering with schools and universities to host leadership sessions for high school male students through the sorority's EMBODI--Empowering Males to Build Opportunities for Developing Independence--Impact program.
- Leading Delta Academy, a monthly education and leadership program for middle school girls.
- Providing representation at diversity events, such as the annual HBCU Showcase at Tuscarora High School.
- Hosting public forums for parents and teens to discuss and take action toward issues impacting African American students in schools.
- Partnering with AARP and Loudoun Bible Church to host a free Identify Theft Awareness and Prevention event for senior citizens.
- Partnering with Loudoun Abused Women's Shelter to raise awareness and draw support for women and families involved in domestic abuse.
- Donating more than 300 pounds of food to area pantries.
- Donating more than 400 bags of gently used clothing to area shelters.
- Raising awareness and monetary support for breast cancer research and St. Jude Research Hospital.
- Donating to the Cynthia M.A. Butler-McIntyre School in Haiti.

LCAC is one of the 1,000 collegiate and alumnae chapters of Delta Sigma Theta Sorority, Inc. The sorority is a private, not-for-profit organization whose purpose is to provide assistance and support through established programs in local communities throughout the world. Since its founding more than 250,000 predominately Black, college educated women have joined the organization.
